Contingency Plan for El Nino & civil Unrest



This information reflects the response work done by the Burundi Red Cross. The Burundi Red Cross with the support of its partners of the International Movement of Red Cross and Red Crescent strictly operates in neutral, independent and impartial manner to meet the humanitarian needs.

Overview

1. Province Kayanza

- 3 electric poles fallen by violent wind in Matango commune
- 2 houses destroyed by rainstorm in Matango commune.
- 3 ha of rice field damaged by flood in BUTAGANZWA commune
- 2 houses destroyed by rainstorm in Kanza commune
- 7 ha of cultivated fields flooded Kayanza commune
- 6 houses destroyed by rainstorm in Kayanza commune
- 47 cowshed damaged by rainstorm in Kayanza commune. They shed cows granted by PRODEFI project.

2. Bubanza

- 177 houses destroyed by rainstorm in Bubanza commune
- 45 houses destroyed by rainstorm in Musigati commune
- 41 houses destroyed by rainstorm in Mpanda commune
- 4 classrooms whose roof was removed by violent wind in Bubanza commune
- 2 classrooms whose roof was removed by violent wind in Mpanda commune
- 2 classrooms whose roof was removed by violent wind in Musigati commune
- 106 ha of crops damaged by rainstorm in Bubanza
- 14 ha of crops damaged by rainstorm in Musigati commune.
- 100 ha of crops damaged by torrential rain in Mpanda commune
- 3 goats killed by a house collapsed

3. Bujumbura-Mairie

- 24 houses destroyed in zone of Kanyosha
- 8 houses destroyed in zone of Cibitoke
- 15 houses destroyed in zone of Buterere
